Fiction Spotlight: V. E. Schwab

When writing for young adults, this author goes by the name of Victoria Schwab. Her adult titles, published under "V.E. Schwab" include the **Shades of Magic** series (**A Darker Shade of Magic**, **A Gathering of Shadows**, **A Conjuring of Light**) and her **Villains** series (which includes **Vicious** and **Vengeful**).

Schwab's latest novel, **The Invisible Life of Addie LaRue**, is described by the publisher as follows: "Making a Faustian bargain to live forever but never be remembered, a woman from early eighteenth-century France endures unacknowledged centuries before meeting a man who remembers her name."

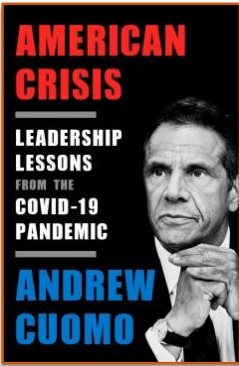

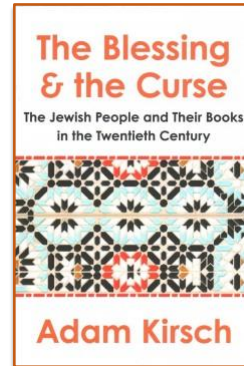
American Crisis by Andrew Cuomo

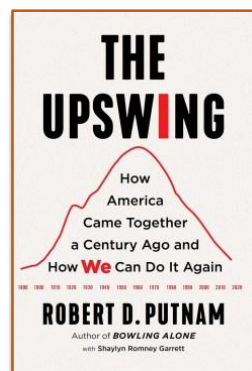
American Grace: How Religion Divides and Unites Us
