2016 Library Budget Vote

The Public Vote on the proposed 2016 library district budget and election of trustees will be held from 8:00 am - 8:00 pm on Tuesday October 6, 2015. Polls will be open in the Reading Room of the Middletown Thrall Library (11-19 Depot Street Middletown, NY 10940).

Those who wish to vote early before the Library is open can enter the Library from one of two entrances located on the Depot Street side of the building.

All registered voters who reside in the Thrall Public Library District are eligible to vote. This includes residents of the Enlarged City School District of Middletown, residents of the Town of Mt. Hope who reside within the Pine Bush Central School District, and residents of the Town of Wallkill who reside within the Pine Bush Central School District, Valley Central School District, or Minisink Valley Central School District.

The proposed gross operating budget for 2015 is \$3,481,497.00 representing an increase of 1.3% from the previous year. The proposed budget will increase the tax levy by \$65,860.00 or 2.23% over the previous year. This budget reflects an effort to maintain library district resources at their current levels and a desire to keep budget and tax levy increases to a minimum.

We continue to be grateful for the generous support we receive from the Friends of Thrall Middletown Library. This support allows us to purchase furniture and equipment and greatly enhances our ability to provide quality materials and programs to our community.

Currently there are two trustees running unopposed for a four year term on Thrall Public Library District's Board of Trustees.
