These are lines from a poem by Juan Felipe Herrera, "author of 28 books of poetry, novels for young adults, and collections for children" and our 21st Poet Laureate, appointed in 2015 by the Librarian of Congress.

This April, let's celebrate National Poetry Month by participating in Herrera's national project "La Casa de Colores" ("the House of Colors") "is a house for all voices. In this house we will feed the hearth and heart of our communities with creativity and imagination. Everyone is invited to contribute a verse to an epic poem, "La Familia" reflecting the American Experience. The poem "will unfold monthly, with a new theme each month about an aspect of American life, values or culture.
