Robert Nathan Isseks

"We are deeply saddened by the loss of Robert Nathan Isseks, a native son of Middletown who died unexpectedly on April 3, 2017. Robert was a highly sought after attorney who worked for the City of Middletown as well as serving as a City Judge and Civil Rights attorney. He was an attorney for the Hillside Cemetery Board and worked as a special counsel for the City of Middletown. He was also Assistant Corporation Counsel. He was the recipient of the Liberty Bell Award. Bob was a nature lover who enjoyed taking long walks through the City of Middletown each day. One of his frequent stops was at Middletown Thrall Library where he enjoyed checking out a wide variety of library items including audio books. Everyone at the Library will miss his strong but gentle presence."

eBooks, Easier...

Did you know many **RCLS OverDrive eBooks** can be **viewed or heard *without* "apps" or downloads?** Patrons with laptops, smartphones, tablets, or desktop PCs can access "**OverDrive Read**" and "**OverDrive Listen**" titles *directly* through their device's Web browser!

Once at the **OverDrive catalog** (website above), you can determine whether a book you are interested in is available in either format by examining the "**Format**" section on the book's information page: if it says "OverDrive Read" or "OverDrive Listen," you should be able to log in, borrow it, and begin accessing that title immediately. Afterwards, simply log back in to pick up where you left off!

OverDrive Read editions are accessed like regular websites, and many can be read "offline" (i.e. *without* an Internet connection), if your Web browser supports "offline storage."

OverDrive Listen books do require an *active* Internet connection because they "stream" (play) audio from the Web.

The White House has been buzzing about the President's new **Budget**, which was just released. Articles appeared in magazines and newspapers listing Agencies that might disappear, what budget lines benefit or will be cut. The Budget is available online *and in paper at the library*. To make sure you get the **real facts** (not the *alternative* ones), come check it out (<https://www.govinfo.gov/features/featured-content/Budget-FY2017>): "The U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) makes available President Donald Trump's America First: A Budget Blueprint to Make America Great Again on GPO's govinfo. This document is an overview of the President's budget priorities for Fiscal Year 2018. GPO works with the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to produce and distribute the Federal Budget. GPO has been producing the Federal Budget since the Budget and Accounting Act was enacted in 1921."
